Soul Food by Bishop Jung: For God so loved the world that God gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. John 3:16-17

For many Christians, our first memory verse of Scripture is John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." This text summarizes our common Christian belief of God's salvific action in the world and why.

John 3:17 personifies God's grace to us and is the foundational element in our theology. Furthermore, as United Methodists, these words are essential to understanding prevenient, justifying, and sanctifying grace. John Wesley, a founder of Methodism, taught that grace is unearned but freely given, even when we do not understand or realize it (prevenient), and when we acknowledge and accept (justifying), we embrace God's love for us in our faith journey towards "belovedness" for all.

During the liturgical season of Lent, we are more intentional and purposeful in our faith journey, examining our life through the lens of sanctification. Asking the questions, "What are the things that are preventing a fuller life in Christ?" and "How might I exemplify Christ in my daily life with joy and gratitude?" These are tough internal questions, and then, there are even the tougher societal questions, "How do I embrace a just life that stands with all those that God loves?" and "What step do we take today towards advocacy for the societal issues of today, i.e. poverty, unhoused, behavioral health, immigration, violence, racism, and/or war?"

God's abundant grace challenges us to live into our faith in word and deed. We are called to be brave. Bravery comes in all forms, but consider the brave women who were "firsts," lay speakers, deaconesses seeking ordination, ordained appointment District Superintendent, or Bishop. These faithful women took the step, and because they did, we have been blessed by their dedication, vision, voice, and leadership.

I lift to you, Bishop Marjorie S. Matthews, elected to the episcopacy and assigned to serve the Wisconsin Annual Conference in 1980, the first woman to serve as Bishop in a major religious body. When Bishop Matthews was elected in the North Central Jurisdiction, only 23 female clergy were in attendance out of the 460 delegates. Talk about a fantastic moment of grace lived out in the life of Bishop Matthews and in the lives of the delegates.

We must also turn our attention to all the women we have had an influential encounter with during March's observation of Women's History Month, who have inspired us in faith, bravery, and vision. It is part of our Christian experience to acknowledge all those who have gone before us, paving a way for us to continue this path.

In the tradition of our Wesleyan heritage, my prayer is," Be present in our day, O Lord. Be here and everywhere adored. May Your grace and mercy bless and grant us to rejoice in paradise with you." Amen.

Through this, parishioners are reminded to appreciate and express the importance of service and care for one another. It is a practice that emphasizes communal awareness and the culture of serving one another within the Christian community.





Pastor's Pen: In the season of Easter, I've been reflecting on the concept of resurrection lately. If someone were to inquire, "Do you have faith in the resurrection?" how would you naturally respond? Not long ago, I came across a video on YouTube about retirement funds due to the platform's algorithm. What caught my attention the most in that video was the unwavering confidence of the

expert as he discussed retirement funds. He passionately advocated for the importance of starting these funds early in life. As I watched, I found myself contemplating the source of his conviction in his arguments.

And soon enough, as I read stories in the Gospels about Jesus appearing to his disciples after his resurrection, I realized where my faith comes from.

The disciples of Jesus didn't comprehend him at all until he died on the cross. So when Jesus was helplessly tortured, humiliated, and crucified in front of people, they experienced intense fear and anxiety because they had a fear of death. They were also afraid of being crucified like Jesus, so they gathered together in the house of one disciple after Jesus' death.


However, as Jesus had foretold to his disciples, he rose again after three days. And he appeared to his disciples simultaneously, saying, "Peace be with you," to those who were held captive by fear of death. The disciples, seeing the resurrected Jesus, might have found it hard to believe at first. However, the experience of seeing Jesus, hearing his voice, and feeling his touch as they held his hands was an undeniable reality for them.

Encountering the risen Jesus had a profound impact on their lives, altering them completely. They no longer feared death because they had experienced firsthand that death isn't the end of life.

Returning to our earlier discussion, I firmly believe that certainty stems from personal experience. Therefore, I hold the belief that the restoration of our relationship with God doesn't arise from complex philosophical or theological arguments, but rather from encountering and experiencing God directly, embracing Him

in our hearts.

I live my life with unwavering certainty in the resurrection, salvation, and eternal life through Jesus Christ. If someone were to inquire about your confidence in these matters, I hope you can confidently respond, "Yes, I do."



You'll come to

recognize that the decision to believe in and follow Jesus Christ, who brings forth a new life within us, marks the pinnacle moment and the greatest choice in our lives. I am absolutely certain of it.




