In Taekwondo in Korea, you start with a white belt when you first begin. You progress to the next belt color through examinations. The colors of the belts offered may vary slightly between dojos. Generally, the sequence is

white belt, yellow belt, green belt, blue belt, purple belt, brown belt, and then red belt. After the red belt, you go to a place called Kukkiwon for an official examination. If you pass this examination, you receive a belt that is a mix of red and black, which is called the first-degree red and black belt. After this, the black belts start from the second degree. I achieved up to the second-degree black belt, but I couldn't find the photos from that time.

Pastor Hakki serves Willow River Parish while also serving as the Conference Secretary of Global Ministries for the Wisconsin Conference. He is in charge of the itineration schedule for missionaries working to make disciples of Christ abroad when they visit our conference. June 7, 2024 Annual Conference Plenary Report of Shared Bishop Task Force

Revelation 21: 5 (NRSV Updated Edition)

And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true."

The Wisconsin Conference is entering into a season when what is new is looking familiarly like what was old. Let's remember some brief history. First Illinois Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church (M.E.) work in what is now the State of Wisconsin dates back to when it was part of the Michigan Territory. United Brethren and Evangelical work also dates back to the territory years.

When the Illinois M.E. Conference divided in1840, the northern section of the State of Illinois, Wisconsin, and a portion of eastern Iowa made up the Rock River Conference. It included districts based in Green Bay, Milwaukie and Platteville, with the Rock River District extending from current 194 across Jefferson County, WI south to I88 across DeKalb County, IL. It was in 1848 with Wisconsin statehood that the Wisconsin M.E. Conference was formed. The counties in Northern Illinois that now are known by that Conference name retained the Methodist Rock River Conference name until the 1968 union of Methodists and Evangelical United Brethren along with the dissolution of the Central Jurisdiction. The latter's Lexington Conference included congregations in both our states.

Also of note is during the 19th and 20th centuries shared districts and conferences existed over our geographical region by German, Norwegian, and Danish speaking congregations.

We have now come almost full circle. United Methodist membership in Wisconsin is now a quarter of what it was in 1968. The Northern Illinois Conference is approximately a third of what it was at denominational union. Establishing the number of bishops, or general superintendents, of our denomination has been driven by membership. Anticipating a needed reduction in Episcopal Areas in the Upper Midwest, the North Central Jurisdiction (NCJ) at its January 2024 special called session authorized combining the Chicago and Wisconsin Episcopal Areas, each currently with an assigned bishop, into a single Area with one bishop beginning September 1. At the same jurisdictional conference, the current Ohio East and Ohio West Areas were authorized to make plans to become a single Area. Subsequent action by the recent GC means there will be one additional reduction in NCJ Episcopal Areas this year.

Information about the work of the Joint Shared Bishop Task Force established by Bishops Jung and Schwerin is in the reports section of the pre-conference materials. Rev. Dr. Myron McCoy, Sr. Pastor of First UMC at the Chicago Temple, co-chaired the group with me.

Both our annual conferences will retain their own identities and organization. The relationship will be similar to a two-point pastoral charge. But being part of a single Northern Illinois – Wisconsin Episcopal Area opens possibilities for intentional sharing of personnel, such as Rev. Cheryl Weaver as the new Benefits Officer serving both conferences. Wisconsin previously experienced the value of an Area Staff that served the East Wisconsin Methodist, West Wisconsin Methodist and Wisconsin EUB conferences prior to 1970 uniting, so such collaboration is not a new experience.

The most immediate location change for both Wisconsin and Northern Illinois will be the establishment of the Episcopal Area Office separate from either Conference office. Wespath, our denominational pension, benefits and investment board, has graciously agreed to host the bishop's office in its Glenview IL building. An office expense grant from the denominational Episcopal Fund will cover costs for that operation. Separate clergy Assistants to the Bishop and administrative Executive Assistants will be located in the respective

Conference offices in Sun Prairie and Chicago. It is anticipated that Wisconsin Cabinet meetings will be commonly held in Sun Prairie as the separate conferences continue to have clergy appointments to sort out. In addition both current Episcopal Residences in Sun Prairie and Chicago will be sold. Wisconsin's Treasurer/DAS Sarah Sneider will administer the grant from the NCJ for necessary technology changes. Those additions will be implemented by Wisconsin's Director of Communications, Lisa Wink. Northern Illinois Treasurer/DAS, Elaine Moy, will serve as the new Episcopal Area's fiscal agent.

Expect to continue to see the bishop participate in key gatherings of laity and clergy in both conferences, and of course preside over both annual conference sessions.

Cooperation between neighbors with shared historical roots will benefit both conferences. As another step into living out our intentional closer relationship, we have friends and colleagues from the Northern Illinois Conference with us today to bring greetings. Let us welcome Liz Gracie, lay member of the Joint Shared Bishop Task Force, who is accompanied by Rev. Danita Anderson, incoming Assistant to the Bishop, and Eugene Williams, Co-Conference Lay Leader.
