Letter from Bishop Schwerin

Dear Siblings in Christ of the Wisconsin Conference.

Greetings in the name and love of the Risen Christ!

On May 1, 2025, the Council of Bishops and the Connectional Table proudly unveiled a new vision for The United Methodist Church—a vision that reflects our deep commitment to embodying God's dream for the world. A world where every person encounters the transformative grace of Jesus Christ, where communities flourish, and where all creation is made whole.

"The United Methodist Church forms disciples of Jesus Christ, who are empowered by the Holy Spirit, love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in local communities and worldwide connections."

This renewed vision is more than words—it is an invitation to embrace joy and hope as we live God's mission. It also provides a clear, Christ-centered framework for missional unity and collaboration across the Northern Illinois-Wisconsin Episcopal Area and our worldwide connection.

Now, more than ever, the world needs to experience God's boundless love. We may soon see the most vulnerable struggle even more—how might this vision remind us how we can love practically? How might we demonstrate love greater than our differences?

Dear WRP Family,

The nature of Wisconsin is truly remarkable and beautiful. Even until early May, many trees still had no leaves, but within just two or three

weeks, green leaves began to sprout as if the bare branches had never existed, filling the trees lushly and signaling the arrival of a beautiful season.

As I observed these rapidly growing leaves, I was reminded of God's timing and the Day of the Lord. The Bible, through various passages, tells us that God's timing and the Day of the Lord will come when we least expect it. For instance, Matthew 24:44 says, "Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect." Similarly, 1 Thessalonians 5:2 states, "For you yourselves are fully aware that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night."


Since we do not know when the Day of the Lord will come, we must always be awake and prepared for that day. I also pondered how these leaves grew so quickly. Though they began sprouting in May, their ability to flourish in just a few weeks likely stems from the trees' careful storage of nutrients during the cold winter, preparing for the moment when conditions would allow the leaves to bloom. This reminds me of the Parable of the Talents. The servants who received five and two talents were prepared even before they received their tasks. When the opportunity came, they put their preparations into action and bore good fruit. However, the servant who received one talent had made no preparations. He likely thought, "I don't know if the master will entrust me with anything, so I'll start preparing when he does." As a result, when the opportunity arrived, he was unprepared, floundering, and ultimately did nothing but bury his talent in the ground.

Friends, no one knows when the Lord's time and day will come. I pray that we may all keep this in mind, prepare diligently, and live out the Lord's commandment to love one another.

On a pastoral update, my parents arrived in Wisconsin on Memorial Day to celebrate my ordination. I can't imagine how much they must have missed their grandson. Whenever they get the chance, they hold Evan, read books to him, and spend time together. We will attend the Annual Conference together. My Ordination Service is scheduled for Saturday, June 7, at 3:00 PM. Additionally, I received joyful news that the Wisconsin Board of Church and Society will be presenting me with the Perry Saito Award. This came as quite a surprise, and it still doesn't feel real. I believe this recognition is likely due to the positive regard and support of my fellow pastors for my ministry. All of this is by the grace of God.

After the Annual Conference, I plan to take a vacation to spend time with my family. We will spend about a week in San Diego, and I ask for your prayers for a safe journey. My parents will return to S. Korea on June 26. Please pray that they have a peaceful and enriching experience while in the U.S. and a safe return home.

You will have the chance to meet them at the June 1 worship service. The worship services on June 8, 15, and 22 will be covered by Barbara, Rev. Paul, and Dan, with Pastor Tim (715.702.2061) serving as the emergency contact during that time.


