Pastor's Pen


The last three weeks were like a dream come true for my family and me. It may be hard for you to imagine how long my family and our parents have been waiting for that moment. One of my concerns was what if Evan cried when he met his grandparents, fortunately he didn't probably because he often saw them on video calls.

On October 6th at 4AM Korean time we arrived at Incheon airport, Korea. First, at Esther's home, we unpacked, had breakfast and rested. For the first time in Evan's life, his grandfather (Esther's father) fed him breakfast. We were excited and happy because we still had three weeks left.

This September through October were probably the most tested times of my life for COVID-19. I got tested in the states several times before we went to Korea, then we got tested again on the day we arrived in Korea, a week after that, and three days before returning to the states. Soon after arriving in Wisconsin, Esther and I were tested again.

Preparing for the trip to Korea during the pandemic was not easy, but it was only because of the desire to show Evan to our families that we were able to endure and prepare for all of them. Evan received a lot of love from the whole family during the three weeks. Thanks to this, Esther and I were able to free ourselves from parenting for a while. For the first time since he was born, we could rest and sleep comfortably! It was a time of recharging for us.

As much as Evan was loved by the whole family, the closer the time of separation drew nearer, the more my sadness grew because he wouldn't be able to see his grandparents in person again for at least a year. The day we left for America, the whole family had lunch together at the airport. After parting, I watched the videos we took for the three weeks while waiting for the flight to Minnesota and couldn't stop the flowing tears from my eyes. After coming home, my mind is still weird. This is the first time I feel this way. It is like a joy and sadness coming from the fact that we showed Evan to our parents finally and separated again. I believe that God will touch my heart and mind and I will be able to settle back in my Wisconsin life and focus on ministry, but now I want to embrace my feelings. Thanks to Willow River Parish and all the church members and pastors and a lay leader, who covered for me, for allowing us these three precious weeks. The pictures below are our families:)




