Willow River Parish Charge Conference

Tuesday, October 11, 2022 @ CLUMC Presiding: Pastor Barb Certa-Warner

Pastor Barb opened the meeting with prayer then shared a video from Bishop Jung for the 2022 charge conference meetings-Radical Inclusion and Racial Justice. Barb then shared some thoughts from #BeUMC, it's a resource Pastor and all of us can access. She shared some reflections on Grace, the hymn Amazing Grace, a scripture from Ephesians and a piece from one of John Wesley's sermons. How grace filled and blessed our days are!

Barb pointed out the Safe Sanctuaries Policy in our white packet that each church has a copy of. She also shared that the United Methodist Church was helping with the Boy Scouts Survivor Fund, our Wisconsin Conference pledge and the overall pledge from the UMC.

Pastor Barb asked us all to share about our church's life and ministry the past year. Christmas for Children with Lifeline Food Shelf assistance.

(Pastor Barb suggested sending a devotional in each box)

Thrift sales each spring and fall.

Horsing Around Days in Emerald, continuing to make community connections.

Our youth group is meeting monthly.

Youth attended the first District event Oct. 8. Zoom Bible Study continues with all 3 churches since 2020

Moving on to Membership Audit Report and Care of Members lists for all 3 churches were approved. Pastor Barb shared that our conference supports over 650 retired ministers and their spouses with benefits. She also suggested that we keep copies of our membership lists in at least 3 places, not just one book. We also questioned if it could be kept in the computer under our Power Church Program. Pastor Hakki can look into that.

All 3 churches approved their leadership lists. Pastor Barb would like Pastor Hakki to contact her in January to discuss going to an Alternative Leadership Board that would benefit all 3 of our smaller churches. Pastors's Compensation Report was approved as was the Resolution on Accountable Reimbursement Plan. There was a concern about the compensation getting quite high for our three small churches and Pastor Barb says that it needs to be discussed in August when it first comes out before we get to a charge conference setting. The resolution on Parsonage Furnishings allowance was approved, this is needed for the IRS for Pastor Hakki.

Faith Family questioned why they were still listed as Forest when they have done all the work to get it officially changed.

We voted on approving our Lay Servants Dawn Cress and Heather Green, Paul motioned and Debbie seconded the motion, motion approved.

Pastor Barb went back and commented some more on our financial concerns for our three small churches. She asked us to question ourselves, "What are our missional goals for our parish and each church?" She also said to not look at it out of fear but what we should be doing and needing to make disciples. She cannot say what we should do, realignment and or different amount of time for pastoral leadership. She said we should always be comfortable in asking if apportionments have been figured out correctly and asking if we need a reduction. She suggested we have open, honest, soft and sometimes blunt conversations about this journey we are on together, being sure to make the journey together in a loving manner. She used something she remembered Bishop Jung saying at his first Bishop's Day Apart gathering. If you think from a perspective of scarcity you are coming from a feeling of fear, but if you come from a perspective of abundance you are open and expectant.

Pastor Hakki closed in prayer.

**Before the meeting began Pastor Barb pointed out two points Clear Lake needs to change/fix on their Trustees report. We do have the Safe Sanctuary Policy-that should say Yes. The other is, Do our deeds have a trust Clause? Those two lines need to be filled out. Willow River Parish College Boxes: The youth will pack college boxes on Sunday, Dec. 4th at 6 pm at the CL Church basement. If you have a college student be sure their address is turned in to Diane, Jan T or Heather before that date. Each church will collect items for the boxes. All sorts of individually wrapped snacks and goodies are appreciated by the students during their finals. Hot cocoa and Hot cider packs, micro popcorn, granola bars, cheese and crackers, candy, gum, Christmas candies, all are welcome and appreciated!

Hanging of the Greens will be celebrated at all three churches on Nov. 27th, Clear Lake will incorporate into the service.
