Pastor's Pen: First of all, I want to express my gratitude to my parishioners who warmly welcomed my parents. They enjoyed the parish picnic meal and the music from the Bell Choir. You may remember that after my mom heard the choir's prepared performance, she exclaimed, "Encore! Encore!" They also had a comfortable stay while in Wisconsin and Washington D.C., and they returned home safely. They are probably going through a bit of jet lag right now, much like we did for the first two weeks after returning from Korea to Wisconsin. They enjoyed the grandeur of Wisconsin's natural beauty and its beautiful autumn season through various lakes and state parks, and they experienced many heritage sites in Washington D.C. They also got to see for the first time how their son, daughter-in-law, and grandson are living in the U.S.

Through their visit to Wisconsin, they have now gained an understanding of the layout of our home, our neighborhood, and how the three churches look. The day after they arrived home in Korea, we had a video call, and now they have a clear mental picture of where we sit, where we stand, what's on the dining table, and the layout of the kitchen.

Perhaps, if your family or children live in another state or country, and you've experienced being separated from them, you might find it somewhat easy to understand my mixed emotions. I am grateful for the days when I can be with them, even if only for a few weeks a year. It brings me joy, but at the same time, being apart from them is sad and very challenging.

Seeing them off at the airport itself wasn't too difficult. While I parked the car in the airport parking lot, my wife assisted them with the check-in. Then, we walked together towards security. Just before they entered, we hugged

each other and waved our hands, saying, "See you again." As we watched them disappear through security, we headed back to the parking lot. It was a bit sad to see my son waving and saying, "I love you. Take care," as he watched their backs, but I think I was doing reasonably well until we returned home.

However, as a certain philosopher once said, humans recognize existence through absence. When I returned home and saw the room that had been filled with their bags and belongings now clean and empty, and when I noticed the fruits, eggs, and vegetables we had shared before going to the airport still left on the plates, and as memories of being with them in church almost every day while they were in Wisconsin, as well as memories of walking around the neighborhood with them, flooded my mind, my emotions became somewhat complex.

But don't worry. I will be okay soon. :)

Someone once said that time flies like an arrow. The expression "time flies" is probably familiar to all of us. However, this expression can be somewhat melancholic because it gives the feeling that past moments have disappeared. I prefer the expression that time accumulates rather than flows. Our time accumulates everywhere we live. The wrinkles on our faces and the gray hairs are also the result of our accumulated time. Though not long, even for a brief moment, my parents' time accumulated in the home, the furniture, and the neighborhood where we live. I am grateful for the time I could spend with them.

I am thankful that God called me to serve in this place, and I am also grateful to have met all of you.

Every word that comes out of my lips is gratitude, gratitude, and more gratitude. God, thank you, and thank you again.

From Bishop Jung: *A cheerful heart is a good medicine, but a downcast spirit dries up the bones.... the discerning person looks to wisdom. (Proverbs 17:22, 24)*

During my episcopacy, I have taught at a seminary, churches, and various organizations. While I have been the teacher, I have found that it is through the act of sharing and participation that true learning happens. It is my belief that learning and teaching are simultaneous acts that continue throughout one's life.

It was my joy for two weeks in August, to offer an intensive lecture at Emory University's Candler School of Theology. It is an honor to be named as McDonald Chair from the Candler community. The seminary course was “Christian Spirituality in the Global Context.”

My interest is in exploring the newest movements of Christianity in the Global South and to ask the question, “How do we identify and join this exciting flow of spirituality?” I carefully studied the spirituality changes in the

world so that in teaching and learning, we might grasp the mighty Holy Spirit's direction for a more intentional missional focus.

For instance, I like reading about the symbiotic power of teaching and learning as lived out in the faith development in China, where the socio-political context inhibits religion and yet Christianity continues to expand. I furthered my studies by paying attention to the coexistence of various religions and faith expressions in the multi-religious, multi-cultural, multi-racial world. This, then, impacted how I led and participated in inter-religious dialogue and encounters in the classroom. It has been through these educational experiences that I gained a broader sense of human rights issues and the beauty of human complexity. Indeed, interreligious dialogue and encounters have taught me true listening, serious questioning, and effective ways to stand on different sides of an issue and yet develop a relationship respect, care, and growth.

It is by critical listening, learning, and loving that we might have our eyes more open, our ears set for deeper listening, and our hearts more receptive to truly care for each other. This all begins by grounding ourselves in the tasks of conversation that include respectful dialogue that allows for the Creative Holy Spirit to work. All this I experienced when I encountered the young theologians and seminary professors this summer. With them I was challenged with new questions to ask and diverging conversations. It was in the enthusiasm and joy of our discourse that drove me to pursue a different level of God, humanity, and creation.

The Scripture text from Proverbs invites us to live with a cheerful heart as we live our lives. I see this as an invitation to be cheerful when we enter tough conversations; to purposefully invite the Holy Spirit to join in the conversation and to seek wisdom – not necessarily being right. Imagine what a change this would be in our world today!

My hope is that this fall will bring a fresh wind of cheerful hearts and blessings to everyone. May we encourage one other in our church families, to learn courageously, practice love, dream anew, and seek wisdom.
