It is a time to say "thank you" to the people who may be most visible as preachers and teachers, but who, in reality, are on-call 24/7 standing with congregants and others to offer spiritual and other support in times of confusion and transition, times of heart-wrenching sorrow and times of overwhelming joy. They laugh, cry and pray with those whom they shepherd and serve. Established as a worldwide recognition time in 1992, the call to honor the contributions of pastoral leaders can be traced back to Paul, who advised congregations to give "double honor" to the elders who managed the affairs of the church well, "especially those whose work is preaching and teaching" (1 Timothy 5:17, NIV).

Mornings, for me, often feel like a time when there's a flow of spiritual energy. When I sit in the church office in the morning, it's as if God is calling me to come and pray in the sanctuary. So, I frequently find myself drawn to sit in the pews. Sometimes I just sit there quietly, other times I open a hymnal and sing. And when my heart is heavy, I simply speak openly to God about whatever is weighing on me. In these moments, I feel grateful that God sees me as I am.

When I sit in the pew, gazing at the cross, I'm confronted with my own weaknesses. By "weaknesses," I mean things like: 'My inability to see others as they are, even though God sees me just as I am'; 'Focusing more on the present circumstances than on the hopeful future, despite Scripture telling us, "Faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see"; or 'My failure to look at the heart as God does.'

People, myself included, tend to take for granted what they already have while longing for what they don't. Lately, I find myself admiring poets. When I read their poems, sometimes they seem illogical, yet they have a way of seeing things that most of us miss. They look at our everyday lives through a fresh lens. Some might say their view is impractical—I used to be one of those people. For that reason, I wasn't really fond of poetry.

But when we face the great storms of life, when we enter the wilderness, what sustains us through those tough times is faith, hope, and a new perspective on our current situation. Focusing solely on the present? Well... doesn't that just make us sigh in frustration and feel more anxious?

Faith, deeply rooted in Jesus Christ, will help us to stand firm in the storms, in the wilderness, and through all the challenges life throws at us. It will give us courage, hope, and a fresh perspective to overcome our circumstances.


