It has already been a month since I came to this beautiful Clear Lake, WI. When I first came here, the tree in front of the parsonage was green, but now it is turning yellow and red. The temperature also dropped a lot in a month. When I take a walk around the neighborhood with my family, the smell of charcoal with the cold air reminds me of the winter when I

served in the Korean military as a soldier in South Korea. I really missed autumn foliage and snowy winter while I was in California. I feel blessed to be able to enjoy them enough in Clear Lake.

These days, I am thinking a lot about worship. We worship every Sunday, but I am not sure that we have ever thought what the meaning of worship is for us. Worship is central in the biblical tradition. The First Commandment says that God is the only one we must worship (Exodus 20:2-3). The psalms call

the faithful to worship: "Worship the LORD with gladness; come into his presence with singing" (Ps. 100:2, NRSV). Matthew 2:11 describes how the magi worshipped and praised Jesus. Paul extends the realm of worship: "To present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship" (Rom 12:1b, NRSV). Surely worship is an important part of Christian life.

We, Methodists, believe the prevenient grace. God is at work in our lives even before we know it. When the Holy Spirit touches our minds, we come to embrace and believe the fact that God so loved the world that He gave His only Son (John 3:16a, NRSV), and Jesus died on the cross on behalf of our sins. We realize that we are sinners and repent our sins. However, we are vulnerable to sin, so we continue to repeat confessions and absolutions during the journey of life, which we call the



sanctification. We have an obligation to respond to the grace received from God. Traditionally, we respond to the grace God have given us through worship.

There are four main components of worship: 1) Gathering, 2) Proclamation, 3) Response, and 4) Benediction/Sending Forth. Willow River Parish worships via Zoom during Covid-19. This is a very unfamiliar time for us, who had traditionally worshipped in church. However, we gather through Zoom, reading and listening to the proclamation of God's word, and praising God with prayer. I am still praying about whether to maintain online worship or open the church.

However, what we must keep in mind is that beyond the form of worship, we must love God, and love our neighbors. If we choose the in-person form of worship, we must find a way to love those who can't



attend the worship service in person due to Covid-19 or personal reasons. If we choose to maintain the form of online worship, we also need to find a way to take care of those who can't attend the Zoom worship. Although online worship can feel awkward for us, we cannot deny that it has freed us from the constraints of the place. Any person can participate in worship anywhere, and praise God. Finally, we, Methodists, should not harm others. Online worship provides a good alternative that does not harm others in this difficult time.

As Covid-19 continues for a long time, many people are struggling and exhausted. However, I believe that during this time God is teaching us how to practice His commands beyond the constraints of space and time. I also believe that He will lead us in the best way and in the right way. We are going through this difficult time, but may our spirituality become deepen. Most of all, may we act the true love of God to the world by the guidance of the Holy Spirit. With the love of Christ, Pastor Hakki

This year has been difficult in so many ways. We have been tested, afflicted, frustrated, separated, masked, sprayed, disconnected and disinfected until we want to pull our hair out, shouting, "Enough!" In so many ways, it has almost been too much.

But through it all, I must admit, I am overwhelmed and deeply impressed by your faithfulness. The generosity, giving, sacrifice, and commitment of our laity and clergy across the Wisconsin Conference has never been greater. Your support of critical ministries has been unflagging and dedicated. We have seen a very small drop in our connectional giving, allowing us to continue to support key ministries. We have been able to keep our financial commitments to Harbor House Shelter. United Methodist Children's Services, and Northcott Neighborhood House. We have been able to provide crucial resourcing to our Camps at Pine Lake and Lucerne and to support our campus ministries. My beautiful people, I am so proud of you!

It is a testimony to our deep faith that we continue to give and serve in difficult times. I pray for the day when the virus will pass, the quest for equitable justice might be achieved, and we can gather together to raise our voices in worship and praise. I hope this day comes soon, but I know that in the meantime our churches will continue to witness to the goodness, the love, and the abundant generosity of our God. Thanks be to God, and thanks be to all of you.


