Reflection by Dan Dick

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe vourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe vourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly: teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. (Colossians 3:12-17)

From time to time I hear well-meaning Christians say something like "Being Christian requires just one thing: faith." Now, the just one thing changes from person to person. For someone else, the "just one thing" is love. For another, forgiveness; for others, mercy or peace or justice or generosity. The flaw in the logic is that being Christian is never about "just one thing."

Stewardship is all about managing wisely and well all that God has placed in our care. To be a faithful steward means to be a faithful custodian of God's vision and will on earth. Think for a moment about any custodian you have ever met. Did this person have a key ring? Was there just one key on that ring. In my experience, custodial key rings are bursting with keys – so many in fact that it boggles the mind to think how one could possibly remember which key goes to which lock.

This, for me, is a wonderful metaphor for Christian stewardship – keepers of the keys. And what are the keys we



possess? Love, faith, hope, grace, generosity, kindness, mercy, compassion, patience, joy, humility, justice, forgiveness, tolerance, peace, gentleness, self-control, wisdom, knowledge, teaching, prophecy, servanthood, healing, sacrifice, gratitude, thanksgiving, intercession, confession, harmony, unity, and dozens more. And what are the locks they fit? Hostility, violence, prejudice, injustice, narrowmindedness, pain and suffering, fear, anxiety, human and natural disasters, grief, addiction, broken relationships, intolerance, economic inequity, abuse of power, and a host of other destructive forces.

We are in a challenging and trying time in our country and world. There are no clear and simple solutions to the overwhelmingly complex problems we face. However, we carry a pretty powerful key ring as Christians. We may not be able to open every door and offer a solution to every problem, but we can use what we do have wisely and well, and in whatever way possible contribute to the good and deny the bad.

Faith Family Update

It has been an interesting time the last few months of COVID-19. I was asked to write an update about what is happening at Faith Family Church. I think the better answer is what is "not happening"--we have had some pretty exciting times. During COVID we had a decommissioning service, sold our building, opened a "new" church in the old Emerald Location called Faith Family Church. We have done remodeling to make the building our own and bring life from our old building into this space. We are working on creating a safe space for many individuals to be able to use. We added an outdoor storage building and took down two very large trees to make the entrance more welcoming. We were asked to start a recovery ministry and are working with the district to make that happen in our building. We recently donated money to four local school districts for COVID related expenses. We have continued to make our apportionment and keep up with our noisy can donations. We are avidly working toward keeping members included and involved. We have a Facebook presence, email thread and messenger, text and phone call tree set up to keep communication fluid. We are working on getting a new sound system. We now have WiFi in the building and parking lot to offer our virtual services and to be able to offer a service to our community for those that do not have internet access at home. We have made our bathrooms family friendly and offer a baby changing station. We updated the flooring in the bathroom. We are working with a stain glass specialist to find a way to bring life to our old stain glass windows. We are in the middle of a kitchen remodel and new countertops. Most recently we have the bell from Forest and will be planning a way to restore and refurbish this beautiful piece of history. This has been an exciting time. We have been meeting as an ad board approximately monthly via zoom so we can stay connected. I know I am excited to see everyone in person; however, as the bishop just announced it is recommended that we stay virtual until the end of the year. Let's all keep praying and connecting with each other as we are able in safe ways. Reflection by Bishop Jung

A Song of Ascents

How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity! It is like the precious oil on the head, running down upon the beard,

on the beard of Aaron, running down over the collar of his robes. It is like the dew of Hermon,

which falls on the mountains of Zion. For there the Lord ordained his blessing.

life for evermore. (Psalm 133) "How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity." Isn't this a nice, comforting, friendly statement? Yet, how difficult, especially when our communities both local and global face such differences, divisions, and threats. We are politically divided, geographically divided – and for a time socially distanced – and we are threatened by a disease that is attacking our health, our well-being, our employment, and our security. Oh, peaceful, graceful unity – where art thou?

I believe we make a mistake with Psalm 133 when we read an English translation and interpret through modern Western eyes. What appears to be a very sweet, yet passive passage of scripture for many of us was intended differently in the ancient Hebrew context. The purpose and celebration was still unity, but hearers might have heard the words of this hymn/song and thought "Uh, oh..." You see, for this song to have meaning, it was an expression of expectation and responsibility. It is both "good and pleasant," and it is the responsibility of the whole congregation to make it true! This isn't a precious wish or even a passive observation – it is the will of God, what God has "ordained" for us all. It isn't an option, and heaven help the person who sows discord, division, or disharmony. The purpose and goal of our life and faith is to work together to create, sustain, and strengthen unity.

This is an important word for our church, for our families, for our congregations, our country, and our world. There are all kinds of forces at work to divide and destroy; the witness of our Christian faith is to prove a better way – the way of unity, harmony, grace, and love. In other words, the way of God. And from this unity that

we work so hard to maintain, we raise our voices in singing, celebrating the liberating truth of God's ordained will for our lives and for God's people.
